





RCISD Hungarian national contribution to the budget of FP5










H2020 first two years EU member states

How to come closer to the framework programme


+ The more national Recources spending on R&I

- Synergies with European Structural and Investment funds are an important component.








Eligible countries for widening support

 - conference attendance
 - dissemination and outreach activities
- ERA Chairs (15/11/2018)
 - Excellence to institution
 - Outstanding academics, with proven research excellence and management skills to universities and research institutions in Widening countries with potential for research excellence
- Other widening actions
 - MSCA Widening Fellowships
 - Policy Support Facility
 - European Cooperation in Science & Technology (COST)
 - Widening Network of National Contact Points
 - Joint Programming Initiative Urban Europe
